## Introduction

We thank you for choosing to become a member at the Caesarea Golf Club ("The Club") and present to you the Rules and Regulations of the club that is owned and managed by the Caesarea Edmond Benjamin De Rothschild Corporation. A lot of thoughts and efforts were invested in the following comprehensive list of Rules and Regulations. The obligations of enforcing these Rules and Regulations for the good of all users is placed primarily in the hands of a trained staff whose principal responsibility is to assure members of all the courtesies, comforts and services to which a member of Caesarea Golf Club is entitled. It is further the responsibility of the member to be familiar with these Rules and Regulations and to abide by them at all times.

## General club rules

- The days and hours of operation of all facilities and services provided at Caesarea Golf Club will be established by the management of the club considering the season of the year and other circumstances. Certain facilities will be closed from time to time for maintenance, repairs and other purposes deemed necessary by the Club.
- Members use the golf facilities and all other facilities provided at caesarea golf club at their own risk. The club shall not be responsible for any accident, personal injury, loss, theft, malfunction, or damage to person or property.
- **Members must abide by all rules established by the Club as they may be amended from time to time.** Members are responsible for ensuring that their immediate family members and guests comply with all rules of the Club. It is the responsibility of the members to be familiar with these Rules and Regulations and/or any Rules and Regulations as amended from time to time, and/or instructions given from time to time by club management, and failure to do so shall not justify their disregard by members of the club.
- When on club premises, proper attire, decorum and consideration of the comfort of others must be observed.
- Members are not allowed in the golf cart storage area, golf course maintenance area, or other restricted areas of the Club Facilities.
- Dogs and other pets, with the exception of guide dogs, are not permitted on the Club Facilities without the prior written approval of the Club Manager. If permitted on the Club Facilities, such dogs or other pets must remain on a leash at all times. Members are responsible for any damage caused by a dog or other pet owned by the member or under the member's control.
- Members may not abuse any of the Club's employees, verbally or otherwise. All employees of the Club are under the supervision of the Club Manager and no member shall reprimand or discipline any employee, request any employee to perform personal tasks while on duty at the Club, send any employee off the Club Facilities for any reason or request the personal use of the Club's furnishings or equipment which are not ordinarily available for use by members. Any employee not rendering courteous and prompt service should be reported to the Club Manager immediately. All such reports will be given prompt attention.
- Self-parking is permitted only in areas clearly identified for parking. Parking must be confined to spaces designated in the parking lot. Parking on grass areas, at the front entrance or in the delivery area of the Club or in any way which blocks the normal flow of traffic is not permitted. "No Parking" signs must be observed.
- Advertisements in any form and solicitations of any kind are prohibited on the Club Facilities and shall not be posted on any facility or circulated at the Club without the prior written approval of the Club Manager.
- There shall be no solicitation in the name of, or on behalf of, Caesarea Golf Club nor shall the name or logo of Caesarea Golf Club be used for any purpose, without the prior written approval of the Club Manager.
- All complaints, criticisms or suggestions relating to the operations of the Club Facilities must be in writing, and addressed to the Membership Manager.
- The roster of the members Caesarea Golf Club is the property of the Club and may be furnished to members in the sole discretion of the Club. The membership roster shall not be used or given to anyone by a member for any reason whatsoever. Unauthorized release of the membership roster by a member is viewed as a very serious breach of Club policy.
- Violations will be reviewed by the Club and may result in immediate termination of membership or use privileges or such other disciplinary action determined appropriate by the Club.
- The use of cell phones is permitted on the golf facilities provided it is put on a silent mode.
- The Club reserves the right to modify the privileges of membership in the Club.
- The personnel of the Club have full authority to enforce these Rules and Regulations and any infractions will be reported to the Club Manager.

## Membership, payments and requirements

- New members of the club must fulfill all the following prerequisites:
  - Upon registering, each member shall pay the full membership fee.
  - Upon registering, each member shall read and sign the registration form and the Rules and Regulations of the Club. By signing the registration form members accept the club's Rules and Regulations as amended from time to time, including amendments during the membership period.
  - Each member shall submit a health approval certificate as required by the Sports Club Law, 1988, within a month of the registration date. Members who do not participate in golf tournaments shall sign a health declaration upon registering.
  - Each member shall attend a session on rules and etiquette with a designated golf professional of the club or an instructor appointed by him/her. Club members must have a basic knowledge of golf rules and etiquette and must be signed off by the designated golf professional.
- Membership fees entitle members to enter and use the club facilities, participate in activities, and enjoy club services during the membership period. This entitlement is temporary, nonexclusive, and may be revoked upon breaching any instruction of this Rules and Regulations Document or any directive of the club management. The club does not award members any ownership and/or rental rights and/or property and/or purchase rights and/or linkages and/or purchase benefits regarding the club and/or its facilities and/or the grounds on which it is located.
- The membership duration is for a period of 12 months starting from the registration date.
- The club offers several types of membership, the conditions and prices of which shall be determined by the club management from time to time.
- The club management reserves the right to alter the types of membership, their prices, the accompanying conditions, and all other conditions, as stated in these Rules and Regulations.
- The Management of the club reserves the right to alter the membership plans, their prices, and all other conditions as set forth in this Rules And Regulations Document
- The Club may suspend and/or terminate membership privileges/use privileges for failure to pay the membership fee, or any other applicable fees in a proper and timely manner. The Club may, in its sole discretion, determine not to seek the termination of membership privileges/use privileges. Such determination shall not be deemed a waiver of its right to seek the termination of membership privileges/use privileges at a later date or against any other member of the Club.
- The Club provides a variety of social, cultural and recreational events in which all members are encouraged to participate.
- The Club desires to encourage the use of the Club Facilities by members and other persons permitted by the Club for private parties, on any day or evening, provided it does not materially interfere with the normal operation of Caesarea Golf Club, or with the services regularly available to the members.
- The Club bulletin board and/or website will notify members of future tournaments, corporate and other group outings, fund-raising events, charitable events and other times when use of the golf course and other facilities will be restricted or possibly prohibited.

## Suspension and termination of membership / use privileges

- Membership privileges/use privileges may be suspended or terminated by the Club or such other disciplinary action may be taken which is deemed appropriate and in the sole judgment of the Club. Including but not limited to the following infractions:
  - submits false information on the Application for Membership/Use Privileges, which if had been truthfully disclosed, would have rendered the applicant ineligible for membership privileges or use privileges;
  - exhibits unsatisfactory behavior, deportment or appearance or acts in any other manner determined to not be in the best interest of Caesarea Golf Club or its members;
  - fails to pay the membership deposit, membership fees, Club Fees or any other amount owed to the Club in a proper and timely manner or habitually fails to pay the Club Fees and any other amount owed to the Club in a timely manner;
  - fails to abide by these Rules and Regulations established for use of the Club Facilities, as may be amended from time to time;
  - is convicted of a felony or other crime involving moral turpitude;
  - treats the personnel or employees of the Club in an unreasonable or abusive manner;
  - engages in conduct that is improper or likely to endanger the welfare, safety, harmony or reputation of Caesarea Golf Club or its members.
- The Club may at any time restrict, suspend or terminate, for cause or causes described in the preceding paragraph, the privilege of any member to use any or all of the facilities provided at Caesarea Golf Club. No such member shall on account of any such restriction or suspension be entitled to a refund of any membership deposit, membership fee or Club Fees previously paid or any portion thereof.

## Membership card

- The club will issue membership cards to club members.
- The card will serve to identify members while on club premises and at club events and must be presented in order to receive various benefits provided to members from time to time.
- The card must be carried by members when coming to the club and it must be presented as required by the professional staff and/or security people if present on club grounds.
- If the membership card is lost and/or stolen, club management must be informed immediately in order to cancel the card. Members shall be responsible for all damage caused due to loss of cards as stated.

## Loss or destruction of property Or instances of personal injury

- Each member as a condition of membership assumes sole responsibility for his/her property. The Club is not responsible for any loss or damage to any private property used or stored at the Club Facilities. Any personal property that has been left in or on the Club Facilities and remains unclaimed for sixty days may be disposed of in any manner deemed appropriate by the Club.
- Property or furniture belonging to the Club shall not be removed from the room in which it is placed or from the Club Facilities, without proper authorization. Every member of Caesarea Golf Club is responsible for any property damage and/or personal injury occurring on the Club Facilities, or at any activity or function operated, organized, arranged or sponsored by the Club whether on or off the Club Facilities, that are caused by the member. The Club shall not be responsible or liable for any property damage and/or personal injury occurring at the Club Facilities, including but not limited to, any damage and injury that is caused by the actions of others. The cost of any necessary repairs or replacements to equipment, furnishings or property of the Club that is damaged by a member may be charged to the member.
- The game of golf can be a dangerous activity and injuries may result from using the golf facilities, from using the other facilities provided at the Club, from adverse weather conditions, including lightning, from participating in events and other activities held by the Club from time to time either on or off the Club Facilities and from operating and riding in a golf cart. Members who, in any manner, make use of, or accept the use of, any apparatus, appliance, facility, privilege or service whatsoever owned, leased or operated by the Club, or who engage in any contest, game, function, exercise, competition or other activity operated, organized, arranged or sponsored by the Club, either on or off the Club Facilities, shall do so at his/her own risk. To the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, members release, waive, satisfy and forever discharge Caesarea Golf Club and all developers, consultants, architects and designers involved with Caesarea Golf Club and their directors, officers, shareholders, partners, managers, members, employees, affiliates, representatives and agents and the family members of each of them, from any and all manners of action, causes of action, damages, claims and demands whatsoever, including any claims arising out of negligence, in law or in equity, which the member, designee, immediate family members, guests and all other persons, may have now or at any time in the future, arising out of or resulting from the use of any apparatus, appliance, facility, privilege or service whatsoever owned, leased or operated by the Club, including without limitation. The use of golf carts provided by the Club or the participation in any contest, game, function, exercise, competition or other activity operated, organized, arranged or sponsored by the Club, either on or off the Club Facilities. Members shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Caesarea Golf Club and all developers, consultants, architects and designers involved with Caesarea Golf Club and their directors, officers, shareholders, partners, managers, members, employees, affiliates, representatives and agents and the family members of each of them, from and against any and all losses, damages, claims or proceedings arising out of any property damage or personal injury caused by the acts or omissions of the member.

## Children

- Parents are responsible for their children and for their conduct in accordance with the club's instructions and rules as determined from time to time.
- Children playing in club-sponsored tournaments or participating in activities of the Golf Academy and Golf School for children and youth are exempt from parental supervision.

## Mailing addresses

- Each member is responsible for filing with the Membership Office his/her mailing address (and any changes to the mailing address), to which monthly statements and other correspondence from the Club are to be mailed. Members shall be deemed to have received mailings from the Club seven days after they have been mailed to the address on file with the Membership Office.
- The Club must be notified in writing of any change of address. Failure to do so shall constitute a waiver of the right to receive Club notices, bulletins and any other communications.
- Club members signing the registration form thereby consent to receive from the club, by mail, electronic mail and/or SMS message or any other means, announcements and advertisements from the club and/or affiliated bodies.

## Lockers and storage

- Shower Lockers, Club Storage and Power Trolley Storage are available for rental on an annual basis payable in advance at the fee established by the Club. NO REFUNDS on locker rentals will be made.
- The Club is not responsible for any articles placed in or around the lockers and storage areas.
- All clothing must be kept in lockers. Clothing left out will be collected and put in a storage room and if not reclaimed within sixty days will be disposed of by management of the Club Facilities.

## Golf rules

### General Golf Rules

- The Rules of Golf of the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of Saint Andrews (R.&A.) together with the Rules of Etiquette as adopted by the R.&A. shall be the rules of Caesarea Golf Club, except when in conflict with local rules.
- All players, are expected to learn and observe the fundamentals of golf etiquette.
- All play shall start at #1 tee unless otherwise directed by Golf Shop personnel.
- Practice is not allowed on the golf course. The golf practice facilities must be used for all practice.
- Slow play is not tolerated. In the interest of all, players should play without delay. No player should play until the players in front are safely out of range.
- Foursomes should complete an eighteen-hole round in the pace of play established by the Club. If a foursome or other group of players is unable to maintain adequate speed of play and fails to keep their place on the golf course, they must allow the following group to play through. Golf Shop personnel have the authority to stop a slow playing group to allow the following group(s) to play through or to require the slow playing group to pick up their balls and move forward to catch up with the group ahead.
- Twosomes and singles will be grouped with other players, if available, at the sole discretion of the Golf Shop. Singles shall have no priority on the golf course and shall be permitted to play only at the sole discretion of the Golf Shop
- Foursomes control the speed of play. Twosomes and threesomes should not expect to play through foursomes and should not exert any pressure on the groups ahead. Foursomes shall have the right of way.
- Fivesomes or more are not permitted on the golf course.
- Continued slow play by players will be noted and the golf staff may attempt to improve such player's skills to enable them to complete play within the established pace of play guidelines. If such efforts do not result in the required completion time, the Club may limit the play of such players to times other than primary playing times.

## General Golf Rules

- All players who stop after playing nine holes for any reason must occupy the next tee before the following players arrive at the tee or they will lose their position on the golf course and must obtain permission from the starter to resume play.
- Players are requested to pick up tees after driving. Players should be careful in discarding broken tees since the tees damage the mowers and puncture golf cart tires.
- Each golfer must play from his/her golf bag and with his/her own golf clubs.
- All tournament play must be approved in advance by the Golf Professional.
- Appropriate golf attire is required for all players on the golf course and golf practice facilities. Members are expected to ensure that immediate family members and guests adhere to such rules. To avoid embarrassment, guests should be informed of the dress policy prior to arrival at the Club.

Shoes	Spikeless golf shoes or other kinds of athletic shoes	Shoes other than spikeless golf and athletic shoes must be approved by the Golf Shop.

This dress code is mandatory for all players. Improperly dressed golfers will be asked to change before playing. If you are in doubt concerning your attire, please check with the Golf Shop before starting play.

**WARNING:** Spikeless shoes are made from material that can cause slipping and falling under certain circumstances. To reduce the risk of injury, exercise caution when walking on wood, steep slopes, dead grass and on hard surfaces such as rocks, concrete, tile, marble, ice and hardwood floors. Worn cleats should be replaced promptly.

- The golf course may not be used for any purpose except golf. Any non-golf activities such as picnicking, biking, kite flying, soccer, football, recreational walking, jogging, walking of pets and similar activities are not permitted on the cart paths or golf course. Fishing in lakes on the golf course is not permitted.
- MEMBERS USE THE GOLF FACILITIES AT THEIR OWN RISK. If adverse weather conditions and/or lightning are in the area, golfers should seek appropriate shelter immediately.
- Management may close the golf course to play at any time, in its sole discretion.
- "Course closed" or "hole closed" signs are to be adhered to without exception.
- The Club may promote a caddie program from time to time, and may impose rules requiring the use of caddies and/or forecaddies.

## Hours Of Play

- The hours of play and Golf Shop hours will be posted in the Golf Shop.
- The Golf Course Superintendent is authorized to determine when the golf course is suitable for play. The decision of the Golf Course Superintendent shall be final. In the absence of the Golf Course Superintendent, the Golf Professional on duty shall make this decision.

## Golf Starting Times

- All players must have a starting time reserved through the Golf Shop. The staff will assign the starting time depending on availability.
- Golfers must reserve tee times in advance as determined by club management, and the professional staff will allocate tee times as available.
- Starting times may be made by phone or in person during Golf Shop hours.
- Persons reserving a golf starting time must give their name and the names of the players in their group at the time of reservation.
- Starting time changes must be approved by the Golf Shop. Please notify the Golf Shop of any cancellations of the group or within the group as soon as possible.
- Players who continuously fail to cancel their starting time twenty-four hours prior to their scheduled time will be subject to losing their advanced Tee Time reservation privilege.

## Registration

- All golfers must register in the Golf Shop before beginning play.
- Failure to check in and register ten minutes prior to a reserved starting time may cause cancellation, or set back of such time
- Players late for their starting time lose their right to the starting time and shall begin play only at the sole discretion of the Starter or Golf Shop Personal.

## Golf Cart Rules

- Each operator of a golf cart must sign one time the Golf Cart Rental Agreement.
- Golf carts shall be used on the Club Facilities only upon registration, payment and assignment in the Golf Shop.
- Each operator of a golf cart must be at least seventeen years of age and have a valid automobile driver's license.
- To help ensure a cart is available reservations should be made in advance at the golf shop.
- Golf carts shall be provided to the member up to thirty minutes prior to starting time.
- The Club may require that golf carts remain on cart paths to facilitate the grow-in of the golf course and based on course and weather conditions. Players will be informed of this policy prior to beginning play. Exceptions to this "cart on path only" policy for handicap golfers must be obtained from the Golf Shop personnel.
- Golf carts cannot be used off the golf course.
- Only two persons and two sets of golf clubs are permitted per golf cart.
- Obey all golf cart traffic signs.
- Golf carts are not permitted on any tee, green or any other designated area. Golf carts must be parked in designated areas with all four tires on the surfaced parking area.
- When golf carts are allowed off the cart paths, enter the fairway at a point past the designated entry point. Remain in the fairway while playing the hole and exit the fairway and return to the cart path before the designated exit point. Golf carts must remain on cart paths, without exception, on Par 3 holes.
- Always use cart paths where provided, especially near tees and greens. Except on cart paths, do not drive a golf cart within 15 meters of a green, tee or bunker.
- Never drive a golf cart through a hazard.
- Be careful to avoid soft areas on fairways, especially after rains.
- Operation of a golf cart is at the risk of the operator and any member using a golf cart accepts and assumes all responsibility for liability connected with operation of the golf cart. Cost of repair to a golf cart that is damaged by a member will be charged to the member. Members using a golf cart will be held fully responsible for any and all damages, including property damage and personal injury, that are caused by the operation of the golf cart by the member. The member shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Caesarea Golf Club and all developers, consultants, architects and designers involved with Caesarea Golf Club and their directors, officers, managers, employees, affiliates, representatives and agents and the family members of each of them, from and against any and all losses, damages, claims or proceedings arising out of any property damage or personal injury, whether direct or consequential, arising from or related to the use and operation of the golf cart by the member.
- Violations of the golf cart rules may result in loss of golf cart privileges and/or playing privileges.
- The use of privately-owned golf carts is not permitted.
- "Discontinued Play" policy for inclement weather is as follows: less than four holes played or 45 minutes from starting time - full eighteen-hole cart rental credit. Less than thirteen holes played or two hours from starting time - nine-hole cart rental credit. It is the sole responsibility of the player to apply for a credit from the Golf Shop on the day play is discontinued.

## Handicaps

- Handicaps are computed under the supervision of the Golf Professional in accordance with the current Israel Golf Federation. Handicap System.
- Only members with an approved handicap may participate in Club tournaments. All handicaps submitted may be reviewed by the tournament committee.
- After each round of golf, players must turn in their scorecard by placing it in a designated box located at the Golf Shop.
- Failure to post a score may result in the handicap committee posting a score equal to the lowest score of the offending individual's last twenty rounds.
- The handicap committee will determine if there are violations in turning in scores and has the right to adjust handicaps.

## Practice Range

- The practice range is open during normal operating hours as posted in the Golf Shop.
- Range balls are for use on the practice range only and may not be removed from the practice range. Range balls may not be used on the golf course.
- Range balls are available through a ball dispensing machine located near the practice facility. Tokens are available for purchase in the Golf Shop.
- Golf carts are not permitted on any tee area. Golf carts must be parked in designated areas with all four tires on the paved parking area.
- Balls must be hit from designated areas only. No hitting is permitted from the rough or sides of the practice range. Members must use caution and hit from a safe distance from other golfers along the tee line.
- Members should aim at the designated targets in the center of the range.
- Walking in front of the tee line to retrieve range balls is prohibited.

## Golf Course Etiquette

Persons using the golf facilities should do their part to make a round of golf at Caesarea Golf Club a pleasant experience for everyone.

- Do not waste time. Anticipate the club or clubs you may need and go directly to your ball. Always be near your ball to play promptly when it is your turn. If a player is delayed in making a shot, it would be courteous for such player to indicate for another player to play.
- The time required to hole-out on and around the green is a chief cause of slow play. Study and clear the line of your putt while others are doing the same. Be ready to putt when it is your turn.
- Players should ensure that greens are not damaged by:
  - Placing or resting bags outside the greens
  - Carefully removing the flag from the cup
  - Gently placing the flag on the putting surface
  - Not Stepping on and carefully walking around the hole
  - Removing the ball from the hole by hand and not with a club
  - The flagstick should be properly replaced in the hole before leaving the green.
- No one should move, talk or stand close to or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.
- When approaching a green, the golf cart should be parked on the cart path on the best direct line to the next tee. This can save about fifteen minutes per round. Never leave the golf cart in front of the green where you will have to go back to get it, while the following players wait for you to get out of the way.
- When play of a hole is completed, leave the green promptly and proceed to the next tee without delay. Do the scoring for the completed hole while the others in the group are playing from the next tee.
- If you are not holding your place on the golf course allow the players behind to play through. Do the same if you stop to search for a lost ball.
- Repair your ball marks on the greens. If you see unrepaired ball marks repair them also. Remind your playing partners to observe this courtesy.
- Players must carefully replace any divots made throughout the course.
- Enter and leave bunkers at the nearest level point to the green. Carefully rake bunkers after use and place the rake outside the bunker.

The intent of these Rules and Regulations is to ensure enjoyment of the club facilities by all members and golfers and to assure them of high-quality and professional golf with all the courtesies, comforts and services to which they are entitled. The club management wishes all members of the club an enjoyable golf experience, in a friendly and professional atmosphere.
